

Colonial Williamsburg Offers Summer Day Camps for Kids 11-13 Select Weeks June through August



WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (Feb. 5, 2019) – Colonial Williamsburg summer day camps—a fun and educational way for time travelers ages 11-13 to immerse themselves in the 18th century—return this summer during select weeks June through August.

“Colonial Williamsburg’s summer day camps are a great opportunity for parents who seek fun, interactive learning experiences for their children,” said Ramona Vogel Hill, Colonial Williamsburg supervisor of family programming. “Campers will get to enjoy an array of activities: scavenger hunts, an archeological dig, historic games and candle-making, 18th-century gardening, military life, animal discovery, music, theatre, trades and much more. The kids will have a blast without realizing how much they have learned about history, culture, home economics and STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math).”

The camps are offered in eight weeklong sessions:

- July 1-5
- July 8-12
- July 15-19
- July 22-26
- July 29-Aug. 2
- Aug. 5-9
- Aug. 12-16

Registration for each kids’ camp session includes activity from 8:45 a.m.-5:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. Tickets are \$299 per camper, per session and include a camp t-shirt. Campers are asked to bring a lunch, snack and water bottle each day as meals are not provided. Campers break for lunch from 1-2 p.m. Please notify Colonial Williamsburg of any special diet restrictions or allergies. Comfortable clothes suitable for outdoor activity, including closed-toe shoes are recommended. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required at ticket registration and is applied to the \$299 ticket price.
