Performance: All Things are Possible (Sundays)

Meet with Robert Carter III, who in 1791 owned more enslaved people than any other Virginian. His inner struggles and new-found faith will lead him to an extraordinary decision, followed by an equally remarkable action. (45 minutes)

Performance: My Dear Madam (Mondays)

Mrs. Washington reflects on how her friendship with Mrs. Adams has shaped their shared role of President's lady. (45 minutes)

Presentation: Pride not Prejudice (Mondays)

This program creates a framework for understanding the connections between the past and the present, inspiring researchers, allies, and members of the LGBTQIA+ community. (45 minutes)

Performance: Cost of War (Tuesdays)

Join Colonel George Washington as he relates his personal experiences in the The Seven Years' War and discusses the physical and mental toll that frontier fighting took on individuals on all sides. Content warning and parental guidance advised. (45 minutes)

Music: Early American (Tuesdays)

Enjoy the music that has come from nearby and distant shores to shape the music of Early America. Programs include, *Dulcimers and Folk Flutes, America's Music, The King's Delight, Music of the Common Man (and Woman)*, and *Things that Go Bump in the Night*. (60 minutes)

Presentation: Deed without a Name (Wednesdays)

Discover the tale of this musical theater playwright, who lost his career due to public exposure of his homosexuality. Mature subject matter, audience discretion advised. (45 minutes)

Performance: A Soldier's Journey (Most Wednesdays)

Meet John Jarret Carter, a solider in Washington's army and a barkeep in Williamsburg. The year is 1781 and Williamsburg stands on brink of invasion! Benedict Arnold's army is marching toward the city. What advice will this military man have for the people of Williamsburg? (45 minutes)

Performance: Designing Virginia's Seal (Thursdays)

Before Americans had a national identity or flag, they used numerous images and symbols to define themselves. Join George Mason and George Wythe as committee members to design the new seal of a free and independent Virginia. (45 minutes)

Music: Governor's Musick at the Art Museums (Thursdays and Fridays)

Members of the Governor's Musick ensemble have a number of presentations on various topics. These seasoned musicians will dive into specific topics with informative and engaging talks and musical examples. (45 minutes)

Presentation: Good Stories about Great Stuff (Fridays)

Join a curator, conservator, educator, archaeologist, or historian to discover who created the object, who owned it, and how it ended up in the collection. (45 minutes)

Performance: To Purchase a Likely Man (Fridays)

Join Colonel and Mrs. Washington as they discuss the intricacies and complexities of purchasing a pair of enslaved brothers. (45 minutes)

Performance: From Freedom to Slavery (Most Saturdays)

After making a free life for herself as an adopted Shawnee Indian, Methotaskee is brought back into slavery. Her compelling story unfolds as her mistress prepares her to reenter Williamsburg society as Elizabeth. (45 minutes)

Presentation: Life and Character of Washington (October 5, 6, 12, 19, and 20)

Join Professor Peter Henriques, a scholar of George Washington's life and character, for a series of seven lectures detailing what he views as the seven stages of Washington's life. (45 minutes)

Presentation: The Jeffersons at Sadwell (October 8)

Join Susan, author of *The Jeffersons at Shadwell*, as she details archaeological evidence that reveals how the Jeffersons and the people they enslaved established families and maintained connections across colonial Virginia. (45 minutes)

Presentation: Presentation: a Global History of Vase Sets (October 29)

This talk looks at vases in the collection of the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation and places them in the context of the history of this fashion and considers its origins. (60 minutes)
